Gary Pond, Rural Health Initiative Program at the McGuire VA Medical Center in Richmond, VA

- Mission Statement: Improve access and quality of care for veterans
- Program is comprised of 3 sections: Veteran enrollment, veteran-community partnerships, and health and wellness education.
- Rural Health Team that work to help the veterans
- Veteran enrollment: gateway into Veterans Healthcare System, Streamline services, determine eligibility (processioning all veterans for registration, DD214- report of separation, 10-10EZ- application for health benefits), follow through to final determination.
- Veteran-Community Partnerships (VCP): increase community awareness of unique veteran needs, foster seamless transition between VA & Community Services, build community relationships & strengthen VA ties, enhance continuum of care, education VA on programs and services in the community, identify programs & services to support family caregivers
- Rural Health Services: Eligibility determination, enrollment and registration, community partnerships, outreach events, primary care on mobile clinic
- Health Education and services: diabetes self-care, MOVE! Program, Hypertension, Cholesterol

- Additional educational services: PTSD, Military sexual trauma, immunizations, reflux-gastroesophageal reflux
- Additional services from the VA: women veterans health care, mental health services- PTSD, Substance Abuse, homelessness, suicide awareness, military sexual trauma counseling
 - Transportation
 - Telehealth
 - Patient-aligned care team (PACT)
 - Polytrauma
 - Caregiver support
 - Home Base Primary Care
 - Nursing Home and Services
- Mobile Medical Units (MMU's)
 - Provider, nurse on the unit. Complete physical examinations on the veterans
 - Mobile Medical Unit calendar set-up for the month
 - Appointments are made prior however, individuals are able to walk-in to the MMU to see if they are qualified to receive benefits
